BACKGROUND

Black Educators Matter

is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization designed to create an ecosystem for Black educators globally. Through engagement and podcasting, we will document our stories and harness our collective power to enact change and make excellence equitable. Together, we will build long lasting, affirming, unapologetically Black relationships, rooted in celebrating educators.

Vision: To provide a safe space for Black Educators to relax, recharge, regroup and reconnect.



OUR WHY, HOW & VALUES

Research shows that <u>ALL students benefit from having Black teachers</u>, yet <u>less</u> than 20% of teachers in the U.S. are <u>Black</u>... with Black men being only 2% of the teacher pool.

We know that the education system is working the way that it was designed to work - it is inherently racist.

We know that teachers are grossly underpaid, under appreciated, and overworked - and that <u>minority teachers are even more marginalized</u>.

Research proves that <u>access to one Black educator</u> can have life changing impacts on a child, a family, a school.

We know that educators are the backbone of the community.

We know that Black Educators Matter.





OUR GOALS

We have several goals working concurrently.

Through our grassroots approach, we've created an atmosphere designed to engage educators at all levels, to understand the challenges and strengths that exist within the current educational structure.

The data we gather will enable us to speak truth to power, demanding equity within education and becoming active participants in dismantling the broken system.

We also are building a global ecosystem of Black educators (and their supporters), and cultivating experiences for them to relax, recharge, regroup and reconnect.

Additionally, we hope to inspire the next generation of educators, encouraging them to pursue careers within the field.



OUR PROGRAMS

Black Educators Matter - Project 500 Podcast

We began with the goal of sharing the stories of 500 Black educators. A cultural bonus would be to help restore prestige to the profession, and increase the number of young professionals pursuing a career in education. This series is a thought provoking, hilarious, vulnerable and empowering look into the chaos behind the classroom, the challenges of the industry, and the journey of an educator.

Homeroom 101 - our new series, will be hosted exclusively on our Black Educators Matter website. Our goal is to create a space for students to speak on the power of having Black educators! We will discuss the influences and impacts, reflect on the lightbulb moments, and highlight the important roles that educators play in all of our lives.

Graphic Artist Jayinex created a stunning Black Educators Matter billboard, located in the historic Bronzeville neighborhood of Chicago. This billboard has served as a source of inspiration and gratitude for the community, and we hope to create more neighborhood art installations across the globe.
